Devonport Devils Masters Swimming Club received a grant from Devonport City Council for new coaching and training equipment in the last grant round. The equipment helps members improve their strokes and offers various training challenges.

Club Captain Nina Edwards appreciates the support, "The club can now support existing and new members better with their goals of getting fit and linking up with like-minded people, while enjoying the experience. The new equipment will add different facets to our training sessions, challenging our bodies and minds alike."

Coach Peta Ajkunic explains the benefits of the equipment, "There are a range of benefits associated with using training equipment whilst swimming. Ultimately, the use of this equipment can help to improve a swimmer's stroke, whether that is through technique or speed."

The grant has enhanced the club's training experience and opened doors to regional and national competitions.

Minamata - Sister City

Minamata recently hosted its annual "Renryuusai" festival, translates to "Love Dragon Festival." This year's celebration marked a significant milestone as it was the first large-scale festival since the easing of COVID restrictions. Unlike the previous year's smaller gathering, the festival returned in full force with a vibrant atmosphere and a massive turnout of attendees.

The highlight of the event was the lively "sou odori," a grand group dance featuring hundreds of participants from the city hall, local businesses, and community organizations. Lasting for approximately two hours, the dance encircled the festival area, captivating spectators with its energetic rhythm.

Another major attraction was the spectacular fireworks display, which illuminated the sky with a stunning array of colours and shapes for approximately half an hour.

Additionally, the festival delighted visitors with a variety of local food stalls, offering a taste of regional flavours. Adding to the excitement, the Japanese Navy showcased the JS Hamana, allowing festival-goers to tour the ship.
