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COUNCIL DONATES LAND TO OAK POSSABILITY FOR COMMUNITY RESIDENTIAL LIVING DEVELOPMENT

Council has agreed to donate land at 108 Tarleton Street, East Devonport to OAK Possability, a not for profit organisation that provides services to Tasmanians living with a disability, those who are ageing, children and young people.

Council's decision is subject to appeal through the Resource Management Planning and Appeals Tribunal.

Following a period of community consultation, eight representations were received which were considered by Council in its approval of the donation of land.

OAK Possability intends to develop the land into a mix of single dwellings and a shared accommodation home of most likely four bedrooms, designed for people living with disability or those who are aged.

The benefits this project are likely to bring to Devonport include:

- Improved specialist disability accommodation for 10-16 people.
- Economic benefits
 – estimated
 \$4.5M construction project and
 recurrent salaries paid to staff
 following completion.
- Additional Council income

 through rates paid on the property.
- the provision of innovative housing for those in need. The proposed development will provide a range of outcomes including social inclusion, health and well-being, independence and ongoing support costs.



LIVING CITY STAGE 1 UPDATE

Construction has continued to progress well on the LIVING CITY Stage 1 Fairbrother site during May.

During the month a number of suspended slabs were poured on the multi-deck car park, whilst structural steel and pre-cast concrete panels were erected on the food pavilion building, visible from Oldaker Street.

The first two levels on the multipurpose civic building are now visible from Rooke Street, next to the Devonport Entertainment & Convention Centre, providing a visual indication of the space which will be occupied by the Devonport LINC and Service Tasmania.

The food pavilion and car park are scheduled for completion in late 2017, with the multi-purpose civic building set to open mid 2018.
