"Vertex" is a welded steel art structure by Ron Robertson-Swann which was commissioned by the Devonport City Council in 1982. Robertson-Swann rose to prominence in the early 1980s when his commissioned sculpture for the Civic Square in Melbourne titled Vault was removed after a short time on display and dubbed 'The Yellow Peril'.

Preeatenna 7 **IOHN EISMAN**

Commissioned by Devonport City Council in 1994. Three metre long stone and concrete blue tongue lizard considered an 'emblem' of the Kelcey Tier.
