TREVOR SMITH – 7 GLEN COURT DEVONPORT

- Q1 When will the remaining manhole covers around Devonport be raised up to an acceptable Australian Standard? You have already made a start with this issue! So can the Ratepayers of Devonport expect this project to be completed, say in 8 months' time, or will it be put in the too hard basket to save money! No weasel words for your reply please!

 - b. Has council funded either directly or indirectly a similar promotion in the last five (5) years?
