


National Families Week Recipe Book

June is Bowel Cancer Awareness Month

The <u>National Bowel Cancer Screening Program (NBCSP)</u> invites eligible people starting at age 50 and continuing to age 74 (without symptoms) to screen for bowel cancer using a free, simple test at home.

Every two years, all Tasmanians aged 50-74 receive a free bowel screening kit in the mail. It is important to have your address details up to date with Medicare to ensure you will receive the kit.

This test can help stop bowel cancer from developing by finding pre-cancerous changes in the bowel or help find cancer in its early stages. When it is detected early, 9 out of 10 cases of bowel cancer can be treated successfully. Infoline: 1800 118 868
