Changes to Ticket to Play

Ticket to Play vouchers help with the cost of sporting club registration for children aged 5-17 on Centrelink Health Care, Pensioner Concession Cards or in Out of Home Care.

Under the 2020-21 program, each eligible child can receive two vouchers worth up to \$100 each – even if they had a voucher during the coronavirus period (between January and June 2020).

Each voucher can be used at a different Approved Activity Provider, or both used at one Approved Activity Provider.

All unredeemed vouchers from the coronavirus period are now invalid. Eligible participants can reapply <u>here</u>.




