





Devonport Local Government Area road side spraying is due to commence on Monday, 3 August by a contractor, weather permitting.

Property owners may request the City to not undertake spraying on the road reserve in front of or alongside their properties by applying to be listed on the City's '<u>No Spray Register</u>' on the Council Website. Applications require the property owner to provide a management plan identifying the method of control for weeds and how regularly the property owner plans to undertake this control.




