A crisis is no excuse for violence at home

Unfortunately, in times of disaster and crisis, incidences of domestic and family violence can increase.

In response to the pandemic, the Australian Government launched the *Help is Here* campaign to provide information on support services to anyone affected by domestic and family violence, to help them access the support they need, when they need it.

The advertising campaign directs people to <u>1800RESPECT</u> and <u>MensLine</u> Australia for free, confidential advice and support available 24/7, online and by phone.

Domestic and family violence includes behaviour or threats that aim to control someone by causing fear or threatening their safety. Domestic and family violence can include:

- physical violence such as hitting or choking;
- denial of essential money;
- isolation from friends and family;
- insults or constant criticism;
- · the forcing of sex; and
- threatening children or pets.

The Cradle Coast Cat Tracker project

Cats are the second most popular pet in Tasmania and they play an important role in the lives of many Tasmanians, but where do cats go when they run out of the door in the morning? Do they visit lots of other properties or do they cross any busy roads?

The <u>Cradle Coast NRM</u> team, in collaboration with the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment, are running a cat tracker project between November 2020 to February 2021 to unravel the mystery.

The Project will follow the movements of 20 cats for nine days each, using a light-weight GPS tracker, attached to a cat harness. This will show where the felines go when they leave the protection of the home.




