Thank you to the Citizen Scientists monitoring Devonport's Platypus population

Thank you all the Citizen Scientists in our community who provide feedback on our wildlife, flora and fauna!

Because of these volunteering efforts Founders Lake at the Tasmanian Arboretum has once again proved to be the leading hot spot for platypus sightings in the country, with 3.4 animals seen per survey submitted to the Australia Platypus Monitoring Network (APMN)

If you are interested in contribution to platypus conservation by monitoring the local platypus population, take a look at the <u>Australia Platypus Monitoring</u> Network website.

Volunteers record platypus sightings at one or more sites using a standard visual survey method. The information recorded is then analysed to see


