


Harmony Day 2021

<u>Cradle Coast NRM</u> would love your help in mapping local infestations of Spanish Heath (Erica lusitanica).

Please report known locations of Spanish Heath via email to Sonya Stallbaum at Central Coast Council <u>sonya.stallbaum@centralcoast.tas.gov.au</u>. Include the location of the weed (either GPS location or accurate description of municipality, road name and location on it) and the extent of the infestation (single plant or area of infestation and % cover of that area).

small to medium sized evergreen woody shrub which can grow up to 2.5 m tall in suitable conditions. Leaves are small, fine and pine like, 4-7 mm long. Young stems have unbranched hairs 1 mm long.


