Amendments to the Cat Management Act 2009

Recent amendments to the <u>*Cat Management Act 2009*</u> are changing the way cats are cared for and managed in Tasmania.

As of 1 March 2021...

- Reclaimed cats from cat management facilities: A cat that is being cared for at a cat management facility must be microchipped and desexed before being reclaimed from the facility.
- Protection of private land from stray and roaming cats: A person will be
 permitted to trap a cat on their private property, as long as any cat that is
 trapped is either returned to its owner; or taken to a cat management
 facility (fees may apply); or taken to a nominee of a facility, within 24
 hours of being trapped. Under the <u>Animal Welfare Act 1993</u>, a person
 who sets a trap is responsible for the care and welfare of any animal that
 is caught in the trap and has a duty to take all reasonable measures to
 protect the welfare of the animal.

As of 1 March 2022...

- · Compulsory microchipping and desexing of cats,
- Keeping a maximum of four cats,
- Changes to breeder registration,

New Members Welcome - City of Devonport Brass Band



Re-Think Waste

Thank you <u>Devonport Christian School</u> and Owen from <u>Re-Think Waste</u> who let Community Services join students in the beautiful STEM Centre to learn about recycling in North West Tasmania!

Did you know that aluminium doesn't degrade or lose purity during the recycling process? This means it can be recycled indefinitely, and - recycling aluminium uses just 5% of the energy required to produce new aluminium! #recyclingisbetter

Pro tip - don't crush your aluminium cans before they go in the recycle bin. Crushed cans can get caught or bounce off the recycling centre equipment, cans left whole are blown from the conveyer belts into the right collection area!

Remember plastic bags do not belong in your yellow lidded recycle bin! Please don't leave plastic bags in your cereal boxes or bag your recycling. Plastic bags and soft plastics can be recycled at Coles or Woolworths <u>Redcycling</u> collection points.

One of the biggest take-aways was about the plastic trays used to sell berries, tomatoes etc. These plastic trays are actually between a hard - soft plastic and they can't be recycled in your yellow lidded recycling bin as they jam up the recycling centre equipment, and are too "hard" to go to Redcycle. 
