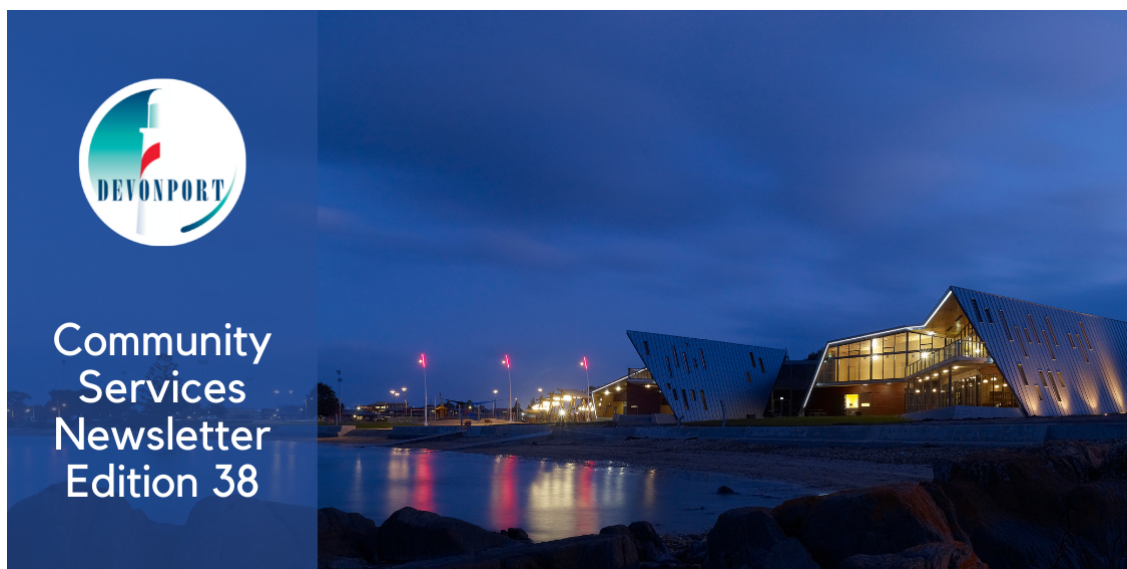


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Welcome to the 38th edition of the Community Services Newsletter!

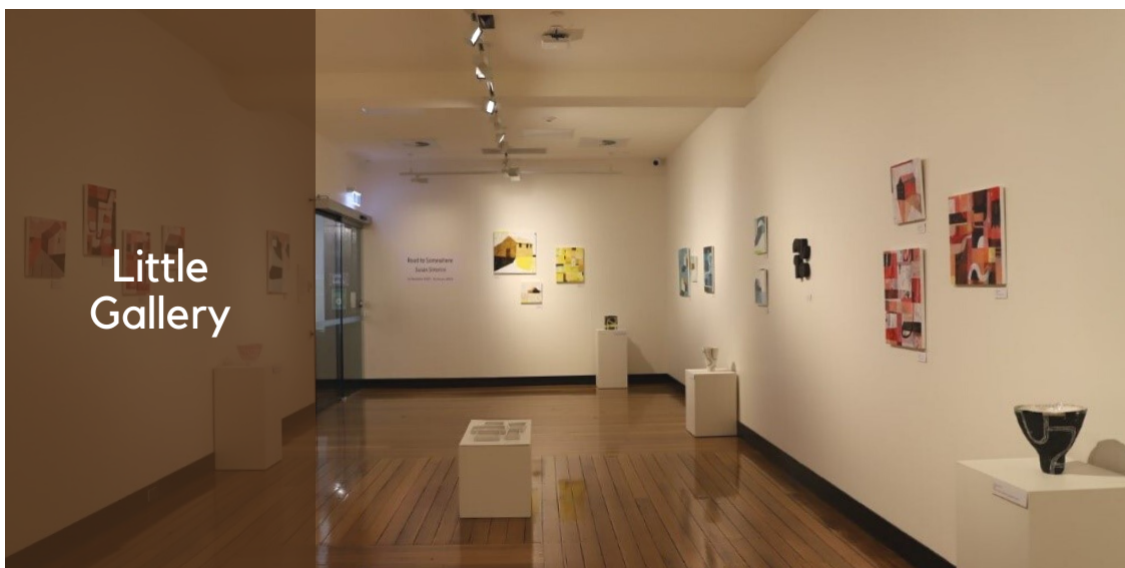

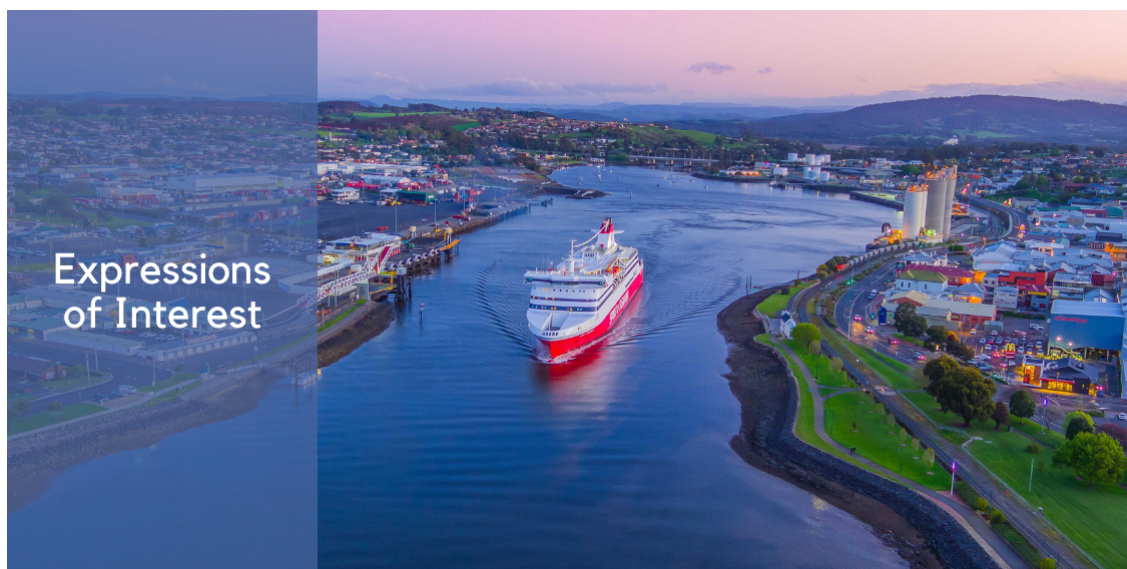

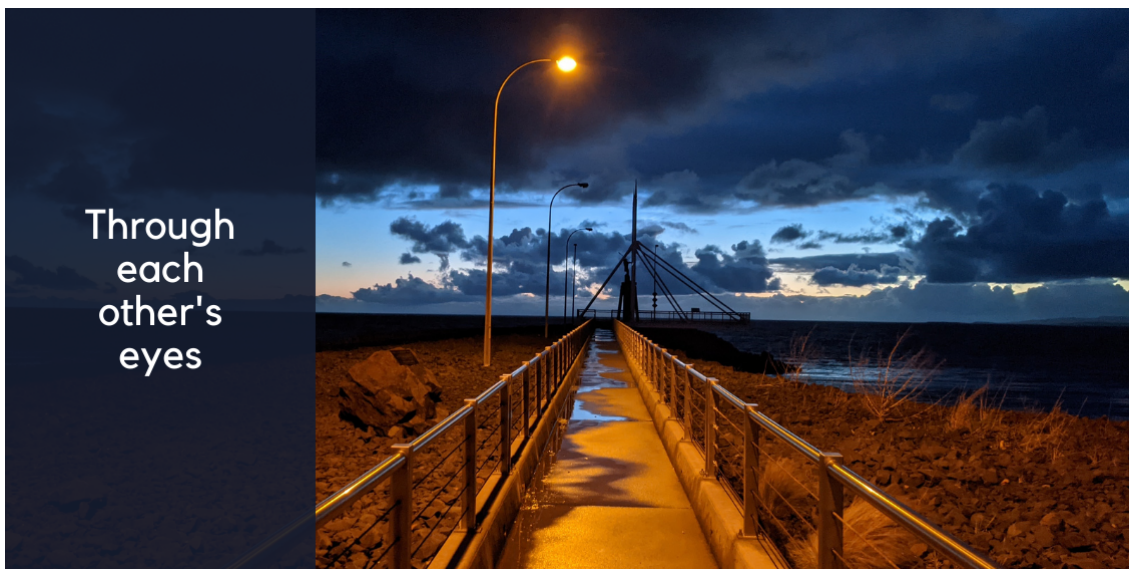
New Australian Citizens

Award categories include Citizen of the Year, Young Citizen of the Year and Community Event of the Year.

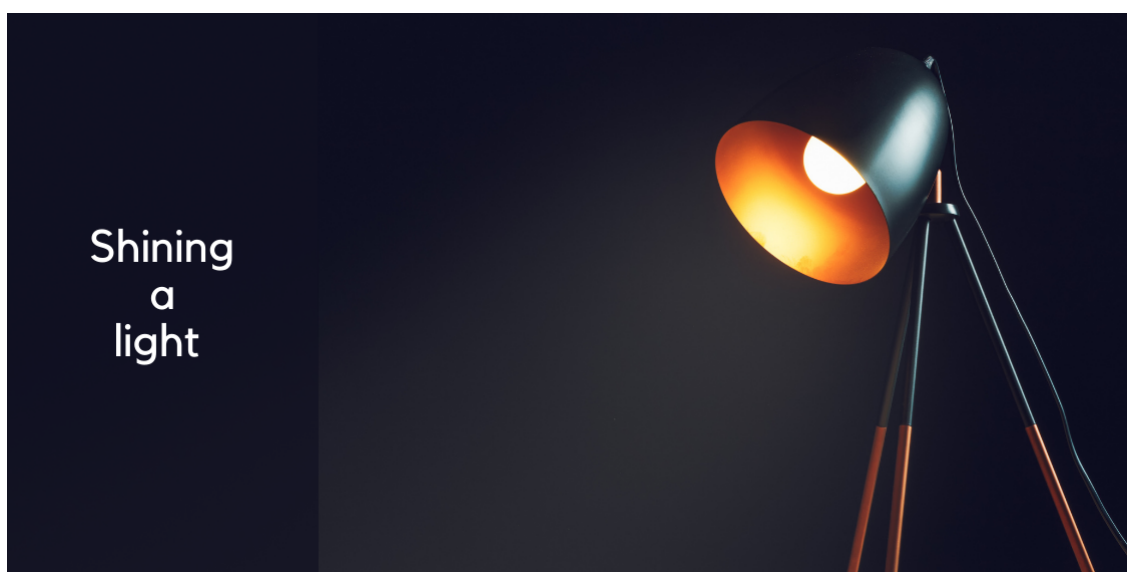

International Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day 16-17 October

October 15th is International Pregnancy & Infant Loss Day, where bereaved parents from Australia and around the world pause to remember their babies who've died. From 16-17 October the paranple convention centre will be lit pink and blue to honour approximately 106,000 thousand babies who lose their lives to miscarriage, stillbirth and newborn death each year.

International Developmental Language Disorder Awareness Day

Friday 15 of October 2021 is DLD Awareness Day and this year's campaign is asking teachers to #ThinkLanguage #ThinkDLD. The goal is to increase the early identification of DLD and support for students at school.

People with DLD are 6 times more likely to suffer from anxiety and 3 times more likely to have clinical depression. They are also at significant risk of struggling with reading, spelling and mathematics. Although DLD is a common condition affecting many areas of life, children with DLD are unlikely to receive access to services.

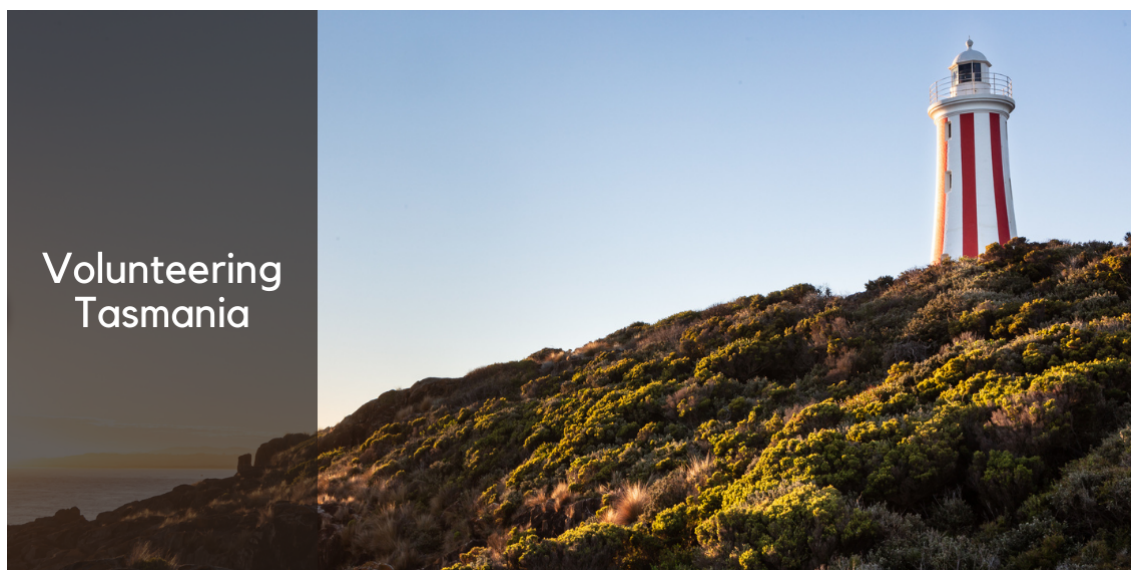

Report a Roadkill Sighting

Report a Roadkill Sighting

The collection of roadkill data has increased DPIPWE's (Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment) understanding of where roadkill hotspots

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A three year trial of an app has recently completed. The information received complemented other data collection and roadkill mitigation strategies including installation of road signage, public education and trials of physical mitigation devices, such as virtual fence devices and culverts under the road.

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COVID Safe Election

COVID-19 safe measure for the next federal election

The next federal election (simultaneous House of Representative and half-Senate election) could be called any time from now until May 2022.

Advice from the Australian Government Department of Health is that COVID-safe measures are likely to remain in place in some form as Australia works towards maximizing vaccination coverage. The Australian Electoral Commission is planning for the delivery of a COVID-safe federal election. This includes practicing good hygiene, physical distancing and regularly cleaning often-used surfaces.

At polling places you will find:

- 1.5m physical distancing
- Capacity limits based on current health requirements
- QR check in codes at polling places
- Hand sanitiser at entry and exit
- Regular touchpoint cleaning
- Voters encouraged to BYO pen or pencil. Pencils provided at polling place will be cleaned after each use
- Hygiene officers will be stationed at every polling place to regularly sanitise surfaces
- Queue controllers will be stationed at every polling place to assist voters and ensure social distancing within the polling place
- Additional staff will be engaged to issue votes to minimise queues in premises where premises capacity limits allows.

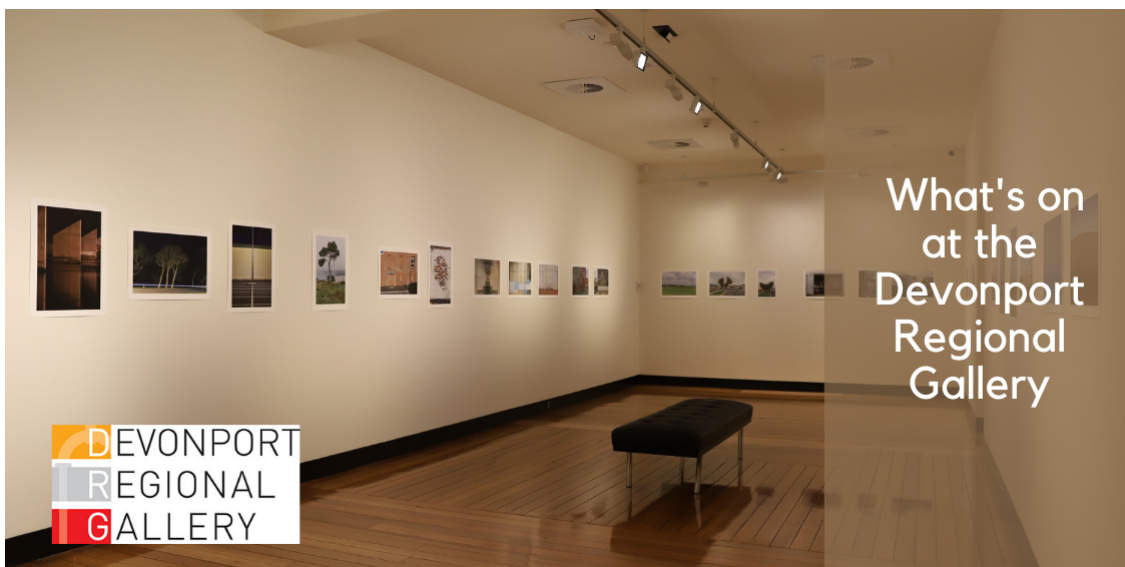

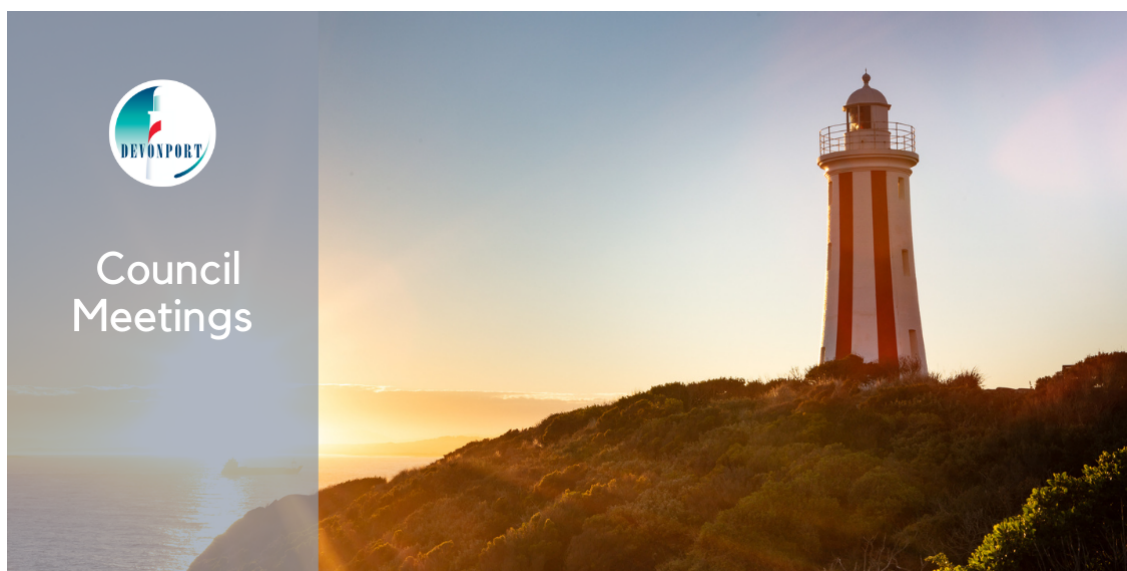
