Deadly Choices aims to empower Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to make healthy choices for themselves and their families – to stop smoking, to eat good food and exercise daily. It also encourages Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to complete an annual '715 Health Check'.

The focus being preventative health – encouraging community to not just see the doctor when they are sick, but to visit their health service and access support to prevent or better manage their chronic disease and remain healthy.


Having a 715 Health Check every 9-12 months means a clinic can build a picture of health and measure changes in a client's wellbeing – helping to prevent chronic disease from become reality, and reducing the impact of existing chronic disease, while providing ongoing health management and support.

To encourage mob to participate, IUIH and licensees, provide clients with a free Deadly Choices shirt. These shirts change yearly, with a variety offered to attract different audiences.
