Masks required for Public Indoor settings

The State Government has announced that masks will be required in public indoor settings from Tuesday 21 December 2021 by everyone aged 12 and over.

- · Indoor workplaces such as offices
- Education settings for example university buildings or schools
- Indoor businesses and shops such as supermarkets, restaurants, or pubs
- Indoor service settings such as banks or pharmacies
- Indoor areas of commercial or recreational boats, unless they are a residence (home). Masks are not required to be worn when a passenger is in their cabin.
 This advice applies to cruise ships and other similar vessels operating in Tasmania.
- · Public transport such as bus, taxis or in a rideshare

Masks are not required to be worn outdoors, unless attending a large event where masks are already required. You may choose to wear a mask outdoors as an additional safety measure against COVID-19.

When at home or visiting someone else in their home, a mask is not mandatory.

Masks may be removed to eat or drink but must be put back on immediately after you have finished. There are certain exceptions to wearing a mask, including for certified medical reasons. Reasons for not wearing a mask are not always obvious so please be respectful of others.



LGBTIQ+ and mental health care survey

Tasmania, is launching an online survey to better understand the LGBTIQ+ community's experiences with mental health care services in Tasmania.

The survey is open from 10 December 2021 until 31 January 2022. Tasmanians aged 16 years and older who identify as LGBTIQ+ are eligible to complete the survey. Its purpose is to better understand the gaps, needs and issues within the current mental health system specific to the LGBTIQ+ community, including individual population groups within that community.

The survey is one component of a broad consultation process, which includes a literature review (completed) and focus groups to be held in early 2022.
