






Community to help name the new waterfront park

poverty for individuals, families, and children: raise income support above the poverty line and invest in social housing.



Polio Awareness Month

October is Polio Awareness Month, and to raise awareness the paranaple convention centre will shine Orange 24-30 October. Poliomyelitis (polio) is a highly infectious disease caused by a virus. It invades the nervous system, and can cause total paralysis in a matter of hours. It can strike at any age, but affects mainly children under three (over 50% of all cases).

Assisted voting service for the 2022 local government elections

At each of the 29 councils, a private and separate space will be provided for a professional, confidential and impartial voter assistance service. This space will be used by people who require assistance to vote. The service is expected to run during the week commencing Monday 17 October 2022 during each council's office hours. It is expected that there will be at least one full day of this voting service at each council. Times will be published on the Tasmanian Electoral Commission website

The TEC will employ independent, professional experienced polling staff at each location to assist the voter with the voting process. In addition, COVID-safe measures will be in place, including the wearing of N95 masks by staff.

Voters using the service should bring with them their ballot pack delivered in the post. If the voter does not have their ballot pack, the staff member may assist them in applying for a supplementary ballot pack while they are at the council. Once the voting process is complete, the staff member can assist the voter to place their completed postal vote in the ballot box onsite.

If required, there is the option for voters to receive car-side assistance. This means the voter can remain in their vehicle and vote while in the car with assistance from the staff member.

To book a time for assisted voting, voters can call the TEC phone system (Free call 1800 801 701) or send an e-mail to a designated e-mail address. This booking system will open from Monday 10 October. Information on the booking system will be available on the TEC and local council websites and via disability networks.

Community Services Fuel Relief Program

The Tasmanian Government has established the Essential Community Services Fuel Relief Program. This is a relief package for not-for-profit organisations to help ensure essential support services for Tasmanians in need can continue, uninterrupted.

The total funding pool available for eligible organisations under Round Two of the Program is \$135,000; with each eligible organisation able to apply for a maximum of \$1,000.

Funding is provided on a first come-first served basis. The Program will provide a reimbursement that covers twenty per cent of eligible fuel costs for the period from 1 July to 31 October 2022. Under the Program eligible organisations will receive \$20 for every \$100 spent on fuel costs for Essential Community Services, with a maximum amount of \$1,000 available per applicant.

Rebuilding Regional Communities (RRC) grants are available to not-for profits assisting remote, rural and regional communities to recover from, and adapt to, the impacts of COVID.

Applications that support community-led, place-based initiatives addressing at least one of these key program objectives will be considered:

- enhance the process of community recovery from COVID
- · communities reduce social isolation and foster stronger, more resilient
- sustain local organisations and their work

Micro grants of up to \$10,000 are available for community-led initiatives that directly and clearly benefit local communities that strengthen local people, places and climate solutions.

Larger grants are offered twice a year for requests between \$10,001 and \$50,000.

Strengthening Rural Communities Round 15 has just opened, and this round includes both tiers of RRC grants. Applications for this round are due by:

- Micro grants: 5pm AEDT, 29 November 2022
- Larger grants (two stage process): EOIs 5pm AEDT, 18 October 2022; Full applications (by invitation) 5pm AEDT, 29 November 2022


Everyone Can Play workshops

Citizen Science: Bogong Moth Tracking

Each spring, Mountain Pygmy-possums emerge from hibernation, looking for Bogong Moths to eat. Bogong Moths usually fly to the possums' mountain home in Victoria and NSW in the billions, but fewer moths have arrived over the last few years and the Mountain Pygmy-possums numbers have decreased.

Bogong Moths usually migrate each year to the Australian Alps. Recent research suggests they may be in South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania, but more data is needed.

If you see a Bogong Moth, upload the photo and location to Moth Tracker. This will help scientists better understand if the moths will make it to the mountains this year.

Your Bogong Moth sightings can help change the future of Critically Endangered Mountain Pygmy-possums and Endangered Bogong Moths.
