



As part of the 2023/2024 budget consultation process Devonport City Council is inviting community members to put forward their ideas for projects and initiatives which they feel will benefit the community.





When possible, the paranaple convention centre will shine bright bold colours to show support and -raise awareness for causes affecting families in our community. By raising awareness, we can generate change.

Feeding Tube Awareness Week

Eosinophilic gastrointestinal diseases (EGIDs) occur when a type of white blood cell, called an eosinophil (pronounced ee-oh-sin-oh-fill), is found in increased numbers in the gastrointestinal tract. The eosinophils can accumulate in the gut in response to food and/or airborne allergens and can cause inflammation and tissue damage. The paranaple convention centre shone blue/purple 3-10 February to help bring awareness to those living with eosinophilic disease.

Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

There is no early detection test for ovarian cancer, so all women need to be aware of the symptoms. The most commonly reported symptoms for ovarian cancer are:

- · Increased abdominal size or persistent abdominal bloating
- Abdominal or pelvic (lower tummy) pain
- · Feeling full after eating a small amount
- · Needing to urinate often or urgently

EndoMarch (Endometriosis Awareness Month)

Endometriosis is a common disease where tissue similar to the lining of the womb grows outside it in other parts of the body. More than 830,000 (more than 11%) of Australian women, girls, and those who are gender diverse suffer from endometriosis at some point in their life with the disease often starting in teenagers.

Lymphoedema Day

Highlighting the chronic condition of lymphoedema for World Lymphoedema Day is on the 6 March.

Lymphoedema is a chronic and permanent swelling of one or more body parts. It can be debilitating and disfiguring it is more than just a physical condition, affecting people both emotionally and psychologically.

It is caused by problems with the lymphatic system, which results in the accumulation of excess fluid.

Coeliac Awareness Week

The paranaple convention centre will show support for those living with Coeliac disease 13-20 March by shining green.

In people with coeliac disease (pronounced 'seel-ee-ak' and spelt celiac in some countries) the immune system reacts abnormally to gluten (a protein found in wheat, rye, barley and oats), causing small bowel damage. The tiny, finger-like projections which line the bowel (villi) become inflamed and flattened reducing their ability to absorb nutrients.

Epilepsy is a disorder of brain function that takes the form of recurring seizures.

National Waste Policy

The National Waste Policy and the Tasmanian Draft Waste Action Plan place great focus on resource recovery and the circular economy, with the aim to reduce waste where possible.

Tasmanian strategies to achieve this aim include:

- The introduction of a waste levy to fund waste management and resource recovery activities (2021)
- Introduction of a container refund scheme (CRS) (2023)
- Transition to 100% reusable, recyclable or compostable packaging by 2025
- \bullet Reduction of waste generated in Tasmania by 5% per person by 2025 and 10% by 2030
- Lowest incidence of littering in the country by 2023
- Reduction of the volume of organic waste sent to landfill by 25% by 2025 and 50% by 2030.
